Charlotte Ryan, 87, of Rotonda West, FI formerly residing in New jersey for most of her life, died on September 21, 2019. She is survived by her children Michael (Florence), Nancy Schulman (Bruce) and Tom (Rob Perley), a cherished sister and brother in law, Florence and Chris Knoster of Lancaster, Pa, 9 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren.
